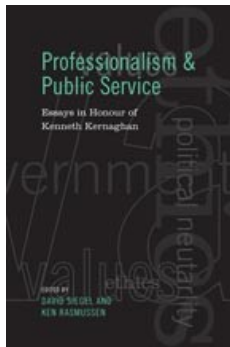

He is the author or editor of more than 20 books or monographs and more than 80 articles on Canadian and comparative public administration. Ken is a past President of the Institute of Public Administration of Canada and Editor of Canadian Public Administration and of the International Review of Administrative Sciences. He became a Member of the Order of Canada in 2008 and has been the recipient of many other awards. He has been an advisor to governments in Canada and elsewhere and served as Chair of the federal task force on the Disclosure of Wrongdoing. He is a Senior Fellow of the Canada School of Public Service and a Fellow of the Institute for Citizen-Centred Service.
