■ **Dr. Enid Slack** is the Director of the Institute on Municipal Finance and Governance at the Munk Centre for International Studies at the University of Toronto. She also teaches a graduate course in municipal finance to planning students. She has advised governments and the private sector in Canada and abroad on local finance issues.
